Some of us lose our perspective for life when we approach the end-of-life with a big question mark as to what our purpose and focus is or was for our lives and the lives of those that we love and are responsible for. Sooner or later things happen in our lives that lead us to the big question of “why”. Then we look at what Gods plan for our life might be and wonder about the next step as to whether it will fit His plan. Always it seems like one step forward and two steps back as we so-to-speak test the water as to that next step. Today I watched a preaching on YouTube of Stephen Chandler on Elevation Church recommended by a friend, and which was a message made just for me, not to exclude many others with a hope and a purpose that was actually centered on Purpose and Focus.
